About the Theme

Psychology as a discipline has shown a persistent commitment to exploring and understanding individual differences. Through its subdisciplines, it has transformed the gaze at individual differences; from being abstract and subjective to being concrete and objective. However, differences on various dimensions have been fault-lines representing inequality of access and power, leading to marginalization and discrimination. Irrespective of the nature of marginalization, the psychological impacts of discrimination on mental health, personal and social functioning and productivity have been widely experienced and documented. Against this background, global societies have seen a push for embracing the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) paradigm. The current conference titled, 'Different AND Equal: a psychological lens to Diversity, Equity and Inclusion'; invites research scholars, practitioners and students to collectively reflect on the various aspects of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion and absorb them in their psychological practise. It attempts to explore various means for institutions and societies to incorporate the DEI framework without merely being an attempt to assimilate differences through an 'add and stir' approach. It seeks to unpack intergenerational, structural disadvantages and their psychological underpinnings in order to enable an effective praxis of DEI, to create safe and affirming spaces for diversity to flourish
